This newsletter is going out to members of the ABC Club and others who have been involved in the progress of the Adam Birding Conservancy.

What Happened in 2021?

- 1. A second blind was installed facing the east ponds. Dry conditions led to great mud flats for shorebirds in the spring but left things high and dry for most of the summer and fall.
- 2. Cool animal interactions included:
- A family of river otters cleaned out the muskrats and vegetation in the west dike pond this winter.
- Several badgers "holed" up all around the ABC and took out some grassland birds on our trail cam videos.
- A white buck made an appearance at our Native American talk on white and albino animals.
- The first confirmed Trumpeter swan cygnet born in Jefferson County happened in the east dike pond with the family hanging out until early November.
- 3. We offered five public tours that included snowshoeing, birding and prairie plant identification.

Looking Ahead to 2022

- So far this winter, we installed another elevated berm with views to the northeast from the woods and mowed some of the sandbar willows encroaching on the prairie. In time, we will install a third blind overlooking the northeast ponds and the Bark River.
- 2. The prairie is slated to be burned this spring, the first time in five years. We are hoping it can carry through the woods.
- 3. We collected, dried and prepped more prairie seed than ever before. Some was spread in the winter while others will be sowed after the burn. We will hire help to manage some of the invasives and heavy grasses that will perk up after the burn.
- We may offer a few more public tours. No dates or themes have been set yet. If interested in leading, please let me know.
